ORDINANCE NO. 18

Bachelor of Science

(Sec. 37(ii) and 39(i))

The examination after the degree of Bachelor of Science shall consist of parts I, II, and III.

A candidate who after passing Higher Secondary 10+2 Pattern examination with Science subjects of M.P. Board or any other examination recognised by the University as equivalent thereto, has attended a regular course of study in an affiliated college of the University after one academic year shall be eligible for appearing at B.Sc. Part I examination.

A candidate after passing B.Sc. Part I examination of the University or any other University of the state, or any other examination recognised as equivalent to B.Sc. Part I examination by the University and has completed a regular course of study for one academic year in an affiliated college of the University shall be eligible for appearing in the B.Sc. Part II examination.

A candidate who has passed B.Sc. Part II of this University or any other University of the state or any other examination recognised as equivalent to the B.Sc. Part II examination by the University and has completed regular course of study for one academic year in any affiliated college of the University shall be admitted to B.Sc. Part III examination.

Besides regular and Ex-student, non collegiate students shall also be eligible for admission to these examinations as per provisions of clause 13 of Ordinance No. 6. Every candidate appearing at the B.Sc. examination shall be examined in :-

- (a) foundation course,
- (b) any three of the subjects as prescribed in the syllabus.

The candidate shall be required to offer the same combination of subjects for the whole course as offered by him/her at the B.Sc. Part I.

In order to pass at any of the three degree course examinations, must obtain not less then 33% of the total marks in each subject. In the subjects where both Theory & Practical Examinations are provided an examinee must secure 33 % marks in both Theory & Practical Examinations separately.

No division shall be assigned on the results of B.Sc.I and II examinations. The result of B.Sc. Part III shall be determined by adding to total marks secured at B.Sc. Part I, II and III examinations, and the division shall be awarded on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained by the candidate.

A successful examinee at the Part III examination obtaining 60 % or more marks shall be placed in the First Division, those obtaining less than 60 % but not less than 45 % marks in the Second Division and other successful examinees obtaining less than 45% but not less than 33% marks in the Third Division.

Any candidate who fails at any of the B.Sc. Part I, II and III examination in one subject shall be allowed to appear in that subject as a supplementary candidate, at the supplementary examination conducted by the University.
