ORDINANCE NO. 26

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION

(Sec. 37 (ii) and 39 (i))

The courses of study for Degree of Bachelor of Education shall be of the duration of one Academic year.

A candidate who holds the Bachelor's Degree in the following disciplines shall be admitted to the Bachelor Degree of Education:

- (a) Arts
- (b) Science
- (c) Commerce
- (d) Agriculture

Provided that the candidate qualifies in the entrance test conducted by the State Government.

There shall be a University Examination ordinarily in March/April each year.

Subject to the provision of the ordinance, the scheme of examination the syllabus and the Text Books, if any, to be prescribed or recommended in connection with the subject for the examination covered by the ordinance and the conditions on which the student shall be admitted to such examination shall be in accordance with the provision made by or under the regulations to be made by the Academic Council after considering the recommendations of the B.O.S. and Faculty of Education.

No candidate shall be permitted to appear at the examination unless he/she attended a regular course of study for the examination in an affiliated college.

The Bachelor of Education Examination shall consist of two parts, namely:

- (i) Part I Theory
- (ii) Part II Practical

A candidate shall be required to obtain atleast 30 % marks in each paper in the written examination part I and 30 % marks in the practical including Viva-Voce for part II and 36 % marks in Part I & II separately.

The division in both the parts shall be assigned on the following basis namely:

First Division 60 % and above Second Division 45 % and above Third Division 36 % and above

of the aggregate.

If a candidate fails in one part of the examination, he may present himself/herself for the subsequent examination in that part only as an ex-student.

A candidate who fails in both the parts may appear in subsequent examination as an ex-student.

An examinee, who fails by a total of not more than three marks in not more than two theory papers, but secures more than the minimum aggregate marks, shall be entitled for three grace marks to enable him/her to pass the examination.

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
