ORDINANCE NO. 30

DIPLOMA IN LABOUR AND INDUSTRIAL LAWS (DLIL)

(Sec. 37 (ii) and 39 (i))

The ordinance provides for admission examination and other incidental matters regarding the Diploma in Labour and Industrial Laws course which is a one academic year course.

A candidate who holds a graduate or a post graduate dogree of this University or of any other University recognised by this University as equivalent thereto with atleast second division may apply for admission to Diploma in Labour and Industrial Laws course.

The admission of a candidate in DLIL course of this University in the mid-term who has already taken admission in DLIL course in other University recognised by this University as equivalent thereto may be permitted if he fulfills the admission qualifications of DLIL course of this University, if the courses of studies of other University of DLIL are substantially the same, if he satisfies the attendance requirement, if the seats are available in the college and if the college rules permit such admission.

The DLIL course is a whole time course of study. Hence admission is restricted to whole time students. An admitted candidate to the DLIL course is not permitted to take admission in any other course of study leading to a Certificate or Diploma or Degree alongwith DLIL course except language Diploma course.

All admissions to DLIL course must be completed by 1st July every year provided the Principal may admit a candidate till 31st July at his discretion and for special reasons with the permission of Kulapati by 14th August. No admission is permitted thereafter on any ground whatsoever. However, if the result of annual examination of final year of graduate or post-graduate class of this University is declared after 14th August then admission must be completed within seven days after the date of declaration of such result excluding holidays.

The DLIL course is not open to non-collegiate candidates.

EXAMINATIONS :

A candidate who prosecutes a regular course of study prescribed for DLIL in the Law Department of a college within the jurisdiction of this University for one academic year may be allowed to appear in the DLIL examination.

State of the State

A candidate who passes the DLIL examination as collegiate candidate shall be eligible to obtain Labour and Industrial Laws Diploma from this University.

The University shall conduct an annual examination for DLIL ordinarily in the months of April/May in all the papers. ;

The minimum pass marks for DLIL examination are 40 % in each paper and 50 % marks in the aggregate of all the papers.

A candidate who does not obtain the above percentage of marks is fail. If he desires to take the examination again he shall reappear as ex-student in the annual examination in paper/papers in which he has obtained above 40 % but below 50 % marks to cover the aggregate and/or to enhance the percentage. If he appears in such paper/papers his earlier marks of such paper/papers shall be deemed to be cancelled. However, he is exempted from reappearing in paper /papers in which he has obtained 50 % or more marks individually. The marks of such paper/papers shall be carried forward.

The scheme of examination, the courses of studies and rules of examination applicable to regular students shall apply to ex-students except those which are made applicable specifically to them.

A candidate shall be entitled to benefit of Grace marks upto the maximum of Three marks in one or more papers individually, in minimum or in aggregate or partly in such paper or papers and partly in the aggregate to pass the examination. This Grace and the Vice-Chancellor's Grace of one mark for passing or for obtaining division cannot be availed simultaneously. However, Grace marks are not added in the total of paper or papers individually (in the minimum) or in the aggregate.

Actual marks obtained by the candidate either as regular or as ex-student will be counted for passing, aggregate and division.

The division shall be assigned to successful candidates on the basis of total aggregate of marks obtained in DLIL examination as under.

First division with distinction - 75 % and above (including grace mark if obtained)

First division 60 % and above but below 75 % (including grace mark if obtained)

Second division 50 % and above but below 60 % (including grace mark if obtained).

Karana (440-196)

The examinee of DLIL examination shall answer the questions either in Hindi or in English language. The question papers shall be set in Hindi and in English languages.

The University shall conduct only one examination, known as annual examination for DLIL. This examination can be taken by regular or ex-students.
