SEMESTER SYSTEM OF EXAMINATION FOR M.SC. IN ELECTRONICS

academic programme for the Master's degree shall divided in four semesters covering two academic sessions. The first academic session will comprise first and second semester and the second academic session will comprise of the third and fourth semesters. Each semester shall normally comprise 90 working days.

In each academic year the examinations for the first third semesters shall ordinarily be held in December the examinations of second and fourth semesters shall ordinarily be held in May.

First three semester shall consist of four theory courses of 100 marks each and fourth semester shall consist of two theory courses of 100 marks each, out of which 80 marks shall be for University examination and 20 marks for internal assessment. Three test of 10 marks each for each course shall be held on the dates specified by the Head of School of Studies. The marks of two best test shall be counted as the award for the internal assessment.

First three semester shall consist also of one laboratory course and one project of 100 marks each. For laboratory courses 80 marks shall be for University examination and 20 marks for internal assessment. The break up of marks for the valuation of the project is as follows:

Project .fabrication (ii)

40 marks

Dissertation of the Project (iii) Viva and presentation

40 marks 20 marks

( Internal assessment for project )

For the purpose of valuation, University examination shall be conducted as per laboratory examination.

Fourth semester shall also consists of one advanced project and one field project of 200 marks each. The break up of marks for advanced laboratory and advanced field project shall be as follows;

Laboratory / Field project Fabrication 120 marks Laboratory / field Project Dissertation (ii)

(iii) Viva voice and presentation of Lab./Field 40 marks 40 project (Internal assessment for lab./field projecti

For the purpose of laboratory /field project valuation University examination shall be conducted as per laboratory examination.

The marks of internal assessment in each course, finalisation, will be displayed on the notice board .

The award of all internal assessments (in duplicate) shall be sent to the Registrar atleast ten days before the commencement of University Examination of theory courses for the semester.

internal assessment of any theory or laboratory course, separately, shall not be permitted to appear in the theory examination of the semester.

Provided that such candidate shall be given only one more chance to pursue the courses in the semester as a regular candidate.

The minimum pass marks will be 36 % in aggregate (in both theory and laboratory courses separately, provided the candidate obtains at least 20 % in each course of the University examination.

\* Provided further that a candidate passing separately in all the papers but not securing the aggregate, shall be promoted to next semester and shall appear in one paper of his/her choice as an ex-student alongwith the examination of next semester to make up the aggregate. Not more than one attempt shall be allowed for the purpose.

A candidate failing in any of one course/project/laboratory work of first semester examination shall be allowed to continue in the second semester. In second semester, he will be allowed to appear in that course of first semester (in which he failed in first semester) as an ex-student alongwith the examination of second semester. For such additional attempt, the University shall charge additional examination fee as notified.

Provided further that candidates failing in any one course of the second semester, shall be promoted to third semester, subject to the condition that he has passed all the courses of first semester.

Provisions of this clause shall be applicable to third and fourth semesters also. He/she will be allowed to appear as an ex-student in the whole examination of that semester in which he/she thus failed. Such candidate (if passed in that examination) will be entitled for admission as a regular student in the next semester, if any.

No candidate shall be allowed more than two attempts (including the original attempt) in a particular semester. If that candidate does not succeed in two attempts too, he/she will have to leave the academic programme.

The results of first, second and third semesters shall be declared as pass/fail. The final result shall be declared after the fourth semester in which the sum total of all the marks secured by the student will be accounted and division shall be awarded on the basis of marks secured as follows:

First Division : 60 % or above marks in aggregate. Second Division:Less than 60% but 48% or more in aggregate. Third Division :Less than 48% but 36% or more in aggregate.

Any provision not provided in this ordinance, the provisions of ordinance No. 5 & 8 shall be applicable.
